- Yi "Bessie" Liu Liu is a Ph.D. student in the Department of Personal Financial Planning at Texas Tech University. She aims to serve diversified groups especially for first and second generation immigrants as well as Asian-Americans to assist them in achieving a better financial future.
- **Diane Marie Manuel, Ph.D., MBA, CFP®** Manuel joined Urban Wealth Management in El Segundo, Cali. after a successful career with Merrill Lynch, the California Endowment, and The J. Paul Getty Museum. With more than twenty years of experience, the focus of her practice is on building long-term financial capacity to ensure a legacy for families and businesses.
- Lauryn Williams, MBA Williams is a four-time Olympian, three-time Olympic medalist and the first American woman to medal in both the Summer and Winter Olympic Games. Only five people in the world have accomplished this milestone. She is also founder of Worth Winning in

Dallas, a fee-only, completely virtual, comprehensive financial planning firm focused on serving millennials and professional athletes.

The scholarship is awarded to financial services students and professionals who demonstrate and act upon an intense desire to promote diversity in the financial planning profession. Criteria for applicants includes:

- Serving diverse communities with financial planning; and
- Increasing professional opportunities for diverse communities within the financial planning profession.
